PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

As we start another summer season at the Shores, there are a number of items that we need to share with you.

First and most importantly is the beach access through Ocean Heights. We have moved ahead and hired an attorney, Stuart Lieberman of the firm of Lieberman & Blecher. They are very experienced in beach access cases and recently won a case in Cape May County that went all the way to the NJ Supreme Court. We have signed a Retainer Agreement with Mr. Lieberman's firm and given them a retainer of \$5,000.00. They have prepared a complaint and are ready to file the suit.

Although we have been discussing the fact that we may have to sue Ocean Heights for access for the past several years in our Newsletters and at the annual meetings, we just recently received a letter from some concerned residents about us taking this action. The Board has pursued this action based on what we think the membership wants us to do. But the last thing the Board wants is to be doing something that the majority of members may not want. Since the Annual Meeting is a little over a month away and we had already arranged for Mr. Lieberman to speak at the meeting, we thought it best that we ask him to stop working on the case until after the Annual Meeting.

It is important whether you are for or against the Association proceeding with this action that you come to the Annual Meeting to listen to the presentations and express your feeling.

Another important issue is the reassessment ... it is still going to happen. The first communication you may receive about this is a note requesting you to make an appointment for an interior inspection. If they can't gain access to your house, they will make their own assumption as to what the interior contains. The reassessment is scheduled to happen prior to the 2008 tax year.

In the Winter Newsletter, I informed you that we had a person who agreed to take on the presidency. That person subsequently changed their mind, and the Nominating Committee has not been able to find anyone else to take over this position. I have asked at the Annual Meetings and Newsletters for people to get involved, and am asking again. I have enjoyed being involved in the Association and being your president. But we need someone else to take a turn. Please call some one on the Nominating Committee, someone on the Board or myself if you are willing to help your Association by joining the Board or taking on the presidency.

There is some good and bad news about the repaving of our streets. The good news is they are going to be done this year and they will be done by the same contractor who did Curtis Point (they did a very nice job). They will also repair curbs where there are curbs. Streets without curbs will not be getting any curbing. The bad news is that the paving work will probably be done during the summer months. Since our streets are private, Brick Township doesn't have to pave them, and if we try to change the date we may never get them done. So please be patient if they do show up this summer.

During this past winter we lost our landscaper, Ed Tomasso. See the article about Ed elsewhere in this Newsletter. Rick Orland has taken on Ed's position

Joe Sgrio has resigned his position of Trustee from the Board. Joe was a valuable member of the Board with good insights and we will miss his good counsel. Thank you Joe!

We have invited the Brick Police to come to the Annual Meeting and they will be there to speak about safety on our private roads.

The refuse and recycling trucks will again be stationed behind the firehouse from

May 13, 2006 until October 14, 2006 from 8:00 AM until 2:00 PM. On June 17th from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM, paint cans will be collected at the same location.

The Board and I hope everyone has a great stress-free summer at the Shores.

HOW TO DISPLAY THE U.S. FLAG

The American flag is more than just colorful cloth. It symbolizes our country. There are traditional ways in which we show respect for the flag. Proper etiquette should be used when displaying the flag.

- Flags should always hang freely but never with the stars down except as a distress signal.
- When displayed in a window, the flag should be displayed with the stars to the left of the outside observer.
- No other flag may be flown above or to the right of the U.S. flag, except at the United Nations headquarters.
- The flag should never touch the ground, be carried flat or horizontally, or be used as a drapery, covering or receptacle.
- A citizen may fly the flag at any time, but preferably from sunrise to sunset except for special occasions or when well-lighted.
- > In times of official mourning, the flag is flown at half-staff.
- > When a flag becomes unfit to fly, it should be destroyed with dignity, usually by burning.
- > The flag should never be used as a costume or uniform.

Recent changes in the law require that all boaters born since 1969 obtain a state boating safety certificate by June 1, 2006 as part of a rolling program to have boaters of all ages certified by summer 2009.

State Police have a new Web site <u>www.njsp.org/maritime</u>. Information about the new state boating safety requirements - the number one subject of phone calls this spring to the State Police Marine Services Unit - is explained in detail.

The Web site provides links to safety trainers and information on how experienced boaters can take a certification test.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Congratulations to all the families who have paid their dues this year. We have the money committed for the one bulkhead that did not get built last year due to unforeseen circumstances. It has been scheduled for fall installation.

Another great Budget Committee worked with me this year consisting of Joan Adubato, Mary Bowers, Albert Martin, Guy Muoio, and Edward Rapoza. Several members of this Committee met with the Executive Board to seek changes to what was being submitted and after a long discussion about changes, the revised Budget was approved by the Executive Board on 5 May 2006. The Committee originally recommended that the Budget have no expenses to be allocated for beach front access pursuits, but was then changed to include \$10,000.00 until the general membership accepted the concept. An amount of \$5,000 was forwarded to the beach front lawyers as a starting escrow and the budgeted item was then changed to \$10.000.

The auditing for the calendar year 2005 was farmed out to an outside accountant. A report from the auditor should be available by the June meeting.

As of 5 May 2006, the Assets of the Association were \$73,429.98. The bulkhead liability of \$22,950 precludes that \$50,479.98 as the remainder. The Assets 31 December 2005 were \$49,352.94 while the Assets expected 31 December 2006 is \$32,074.92. The Board tries to maintain \$20,000 Reserve always to be held for emergencies.
